1. Project Background

The recent severe flooding caused by a typhoon devastated large areas of Chiang Rai and several northern provinces of Thailand. The disaster damaged households, displaced people, affected livestock, and caused significant destruction to schools—particularly those with limited government budget support.

Ban Sop Pao Community School, a small community-based school located in Phaya Mengrai District, Chiang Rai, was among those severely affected. The flooding caused extensive damage to school facilities and infrastructure, disrupting both teaching and learning activities. Urgent restoration was therefore required to ensure students and teachers could return to a safe and supportive educational environment.
